Junior Year – **G**OAL SETTING – make decisions about your future.

- Update your four year plan and goals

- List your honors, activities and community service since your freshmen year
- Collect letters of recommendation
- Take college field trips, in person or virtually via the Internet
- Set up an email account JUST for colleges information to make it easy for you.
- Explore your career and talk to experts in the field
- Take your ACT and SAT exams in the Spring

SENIOR YEAR – **S**UCCESS – time for action on your decisions!

- Finalize your goal for your future after high school
- Attend any and all workshops and guest speakers, especially in YOUR Career Center.
- Put together your portfolio of your list of honors, awards, activities, work experience and community service. Make a list! Remember, if it is a PAID activity, it can be work experience. If it is UNPAID, it can be community service.
- Collect letters of recommendation. Our suggestion is to ask TEN people for letters. They
 should address the three main facets of YOU. Academics, activities and any service or
 someone who knows your personal qualities. Be respectful of people's time and ask TWO
 weeks in advance.
- Do an autobiography about yourself. This can be used for MANY scholarships.
- Do the master scholarship application for Oak Hills Bulldog Seniors.
- Request official transcripts for scholarships and/or colleges
- Make a list of colleges to which you will apply. Put specific materials and information needed for each college and apply!
- Set up an email account JUST for colleges information to make it easy for you.
- Make a list of your passwords for college, financial aid, emails, etc.
- Take your ACT and/or SAT by December. Use study tools such as workshops and online sources.
- Continue to apply for scholarships and explore financial aid
- Do your Cal Grant forms as soon as you get them in your first grad check AND turn them in!
- Do your FAFSA in January.
- Take AP tests to get ahead in college
- Get ready for college and follow up with your chosen college! (housing, letter of intent, budget, orientations, etc. etc.)
